It bridges classroom learning with practical, real-world skills and offers relatable role models from the community to guide young people.

Early, meaningful career conversations are essential to help students recognize their potential and explore a broad spectrum of opportunities. In this initiative, our purpose and goals include:

YOUR ROLE AS A CAREER COACH

Role Overview:

As a Career Coach, you play a key role in helping Grade 9 and 10 students explore their options. At this stage, they are just beginning to think about their future, and your real-world insights can make different pathways feel tangible and achievable.

Your personal journey helps students connect their interests and skills to real-world opportunities, showing them how different industries operate and how careers take shape within them.

Key Responsibilities

- **Share Your Story** Provide an engaging and relatable overview of your career journey.
- **Explain Your Path** Discuss the steps you took, the challenges you faced, and key moments that shaped your career.
- Encourage Interaction Invite student questions and foster reflective discussions.
- Offer Practical Insights Share advice and lessons learned that can help students navigate their own career exploration.

Your conversation will inspire students to think about their future with confidence and show them that career paths are not always linear—but they are full of opportunities!

Prepare for a Conversation, Not a Presentation

This session is designed to be an open and engaging conversation rather than a formal presentation. No slides or visuals are needed—just be ready to share your experiences naturally. The goal is to spark curiosity, answer questions, and encourage students to explore possibilities.



The following section is designed to help you prepare for your role as a Career Coach during the session. Use it as a checklist and reference to ensure you're ready to inspire and engage students effectively.



REVIEW YOUR JOURNEY

Reflecting on and organizing your experiences will help you craft an authentic and inspiring narrative. Use the following prompts to flesh out your story:

• Background, Education & Early Interests:

 Describe where your academic journey began. Which schools did you attend? What subjects or activities sparked your interest? Consider early influences such as inspiring teachers, family encouragement, or extracurricular activities that hinted at your future path.

• Career Path:

- Identify major choices that significantly influenced your direction—such as accepting your first job or switching industries.
- Reflect on pivotal moments when your path changed course. What events or opportunities prompted these shifts?
- Highlight specific roles or projects that offered significant learning opportunities.

• Learning Moments:

o Identify key insights gained from both struggles and triumphs. Consider how mentorship, continuous learning, or self-reflection influenced your journey.







IDENTIFY KEY TAKEAWAYS

Reflect on your journey to extract lessons that can benefit students starting their own career paths. Here are some examples:

- **Embrace Lifelong Learning:** Continuous learning and skill development are essential for career growth.
- **Resilience is Key:** Setbacks are inevitable. Share how bouncing back from failures built your strength.
- Value Mentorship and Networking: Seek advice from mentors and build professional relationships that open doors.
- Adaptability and Flexibility: Remain open to change; career paths are rarely linear. Be willing to pivot when new opportunities emerge.
- **Trust Your Instincts:** Listen to your inner voice when making decisions. Sometimes, the best opportunities come from trusting your gut.
- **Balance Passion with Practicality:** Align what you love with market realities to achieve both personal fulfillment and professional success.
- **Self-Reflection is Essential:** Regularly reflect on your experiences to recognize growth areas and learn from both successes and setbacks.
- **Patience and Persistence:** Success often requires time and consistent effort— even in the face of obstacles.



REFLECT ON YOUR INDUSTRY

• Evolution of the Industry:

 How has the industry evolved during your career? Consider technological advancements, regulatory shifts, or market changes.

• Emerging Trends:

- o Identify changes in consumer demands, technology, or business models.
- Share how these trends are influencing opportunities and challenges in your field.

• Opportunities and Challenges:

- Discuss areas within your industry that are growing and the types of skills in high demand.
- Highlight new avenues or emerging niches that might intrigue students.
- Acknowledge obstacles individuals in your field may encounter and share strategies for overcoming them.

• Impact on Your Career:

- Explain how industry changes influenced your career decisions.
- Discuss whether shifts in the industry opened new pathways or required you to adapt.

• Advice for Students:

- Suggest ways to gain exposure (e.g., internships, mentorships, industry events).
- $\circ\;$ Share advice on the skills and knowledge crucial for success in your industry.







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PUT IT ALL TOGETHER

• Crafting Your Narrative:

 Combine the elements above into a coherent and engaging narrative. Strive for a balance between honest reflection about challenges and enthusiasm about your achievements.

• Practice and Reflection:

 Rehearse your story until it comes naturally. Consider drafting a timeline or bullet points to visualize the key stages of your journey, and ask a trusted colleague or mentor for feedback.

• Remember, this is a conversation, not a presentation.

 Focus on creating an open dialogue where students feel comfortable asking questions and sharing their thoughts. Aim for a natural, engaging exchange rather than a scripted speech.
